

CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST TO CONDUCT A MID-TERM EVALUATION:

Sexual and Reproductive Health & Economic empowerment Supporting Out of school Adolescent Girls' Rights and Skills (SHESOARS)

CARE International is a leading humanitarian organization dedicated to fighting poverty and social injustice, with special emphasis on investing in women and girls. CARE International has been working in Uganda for more than 50 years, both supporting the development process and humanitarian responses. CARE International in Uganda in partnership with CARE Canada, and with three international partners (Youth Coalition, Center for Reproductive Rights, and Restless Development, as well as the National partners (ROM and NTHIC), is implementing the seven-year (04/2021-03/2028) SHESOARS Project.

CARE International in Uganda is looking for consultancy services to conduct a Mid-Term Evaluation for SHESOARS in its fourth year. The purpose of the evaluation is to examine the current knowledge, attitudes, and practices (KAP) related to sexual reproductive health and gender equality among adolescents, particularly out-of-school adolescents, to enhance project effectiveness. The mid-term evaluation will employ a cross-sectional mixed method, including a Quantitative Household Coverage Survey and a Qualitative Gender and Power Analysis that involves Focus Group Discussions, Key Informant Interviews, Individual In-depth Interviews, Outcome Harvesting, and HMIS data analysis. Through this evaluation, we aim to gain a better understanding of the project's progress, participants' assessment of the project intervention, and the areas that require further action. The insights from the evaluation will help us to adapt the project design and implementation to improve the follow-up implementation of SHESOARS.

A qualified national expert based in Uganda, with extensive experience in public health and sexual reproductive health rights, preferably with a background and experience in gender, will conduct the evaluation.

The evaluation will focus on the knowledge, attitudes, and practices (KAP), effectiveness, and Impact of the changes created by the project intervention, through both outcome and process evaluation. The consultants are required to adopt the proposed methodology in the Terms of Reference (TOR) to accomplish the tasks. You are required to submit a technical and financial proposal.
